
This year on December 5th, Sky Knights members celebrated the Holiday in accustomed luxury at the historic Valentino's on 33rd Street. As special guest speaker for this years Christmas get-together, we enjoyed the presence of Clyde and Eleanor Peter. Actually, it's not clear who enjoyed whose company the most: Clyde and Eleanor are both wonderfully genuine 'good guys' and they seemed as pleased to be in a roomful of aviation buffs as we were to have someone with their aviation background distinguished accept our invitation.

After everyone had eaten all they possibly could, Ron Miller gave a very nice introduction to Clyde, and for the next hour, he kept everyone spellbound. Fascinated by flying since he was a young boy growing up on the plains of a northern Kansas farm, he trained in several different Piper 'Super Cubs,' finally soloing in an Aeronca Champ and receiving his pilot's license at age 16.

Perhaps the earliest of Clyde's challenges was to find a way to earn a living driving an airplane instead of a farm tractor. One early flying job he took was ferrying skydivers. Not at all upset by the fact that the majority of his passengers elected to jump from his airplane rather than experience his landings, it wasn't long before Clyde

took up skydiving himself (presumably with someone else piloting—Editor). He went on to earn his commercial pilot's license, with certification in multi-engine, rotary wing, and jet aircraft.

Many would consider this a full life, but, a man of deep faith, Clyde elected to put his skills to use as a



missionary flying over the jungles of Peru, actually living there for over 10 years with frequent return trips each year. He narrated while showing a video taken on one of his recent trips. Flying doctors and medical personnel and supplies into the remote villages on the Peruvian headwaters of the Amazon River, Clyde became quite a skilled health care person in his own right, by his estimate pulling over 30,000 teeth in his time in Peru. Flving six-passenger Amphibian seaplane and a Cessna 182 fitted with oversize 'bush' tires to ferry in the volunteer medics and supplies, he spent hundreds of days each year living in the jungle villages amongst some of the most isolated citizens in the New World. seeing the conditions that many Peruvian citizens consider 'normal', it really makes you appreciate the many things we take for granted.

Many of the items Clyde brought to show were handmade by the Peruvians and included a drum, assorted wooden tools, a mounted piranha fish and a *very* large snakeskin from a Boa Constrictor. I asked him how they captured the snake, and his answer revealed that life in the rain forest isn't *constantly* harrowing, however. "Well, one night, the snake crawled into a chicken house and ate his fill of chicken. By the time he wasn't

hungry anymore, the hole that he came in through wasn't big enough anymore either."

January 2, 2004

Mike reminded us that the Sky Knight auction is coming up Feb. 7 and that after the meeting Friday Feb. 6th we need to go over and start setting up. Breakfast and lunch will be served and we will need a lot of helpers. Contact Neil Rohrke if you are interested in helping. We are going to try to have the June Fun Fly the first week in June. Tom Wild is planning a Regional Combat Sept. 18th and 19th. Dave Reiber is having the Night Fly after the Sept. meeting and is planning to have the Mall Show in April, get those hanger queens ready. Don Svoboda announced the Jet Rally would be August 6th 7th and 8th. He also heard that Omaha is planning a Scale Masters Meet but no word on a tentative date. Tom Hefley reminded the club that indoor flying is going on at Calvert Recreation Center if anyone's interested stop on out

NEW MEMBERS: Alan Zinnecker from Hickman was voted in by the membership. He is a former member but will need some help from us getting started again. He has a trainer and is ready to go. Welcome back to the club.

OLD BUSINESS: Resurfacing the runway was discussed with some members having concerns about new houses being built closer and closer to the field. Concerns about our current field's future were discussed along with the floodway and flood plain issues. The Omahawks field being in the middle of a housing development in Omaha was brought up by Don Svoboda. The Omahawks field rules do not allow them to fly before 9:00 AM and we may have to compensate for our surroundings to keep the neighbors happy in the future. Alan Zinnecker said he was doing work in the new Waverly area housing developments and felt that they were more likely to expand to the south, east and west than to the north because of the flood way problem. He also commented that the city of Waverly probably has a comprehensive growth plan that we could look at to see what the city is planning in the future.

The lock on the gate will go on after the February meeting. You will receive the combination to the lock if your dues and runway fees are paid. Do not share this combination with others so we will not have non-paying individuals flying at our field. We also are concerned about non-insured people on our property for which we could be liable.

Dennis and Tyler Osborn volunteered to make a new LSK sign for the field, thanks guys. New no trespassing

signs will be going up soon.

NEW BUSINESS: John Willman suggested we create a capital-spending plan both short term and long term along with a budget. Leonard Akert commented that the club officers created these in the late 90s and no one has paid any attention to them. Leonard commented it is a good idea and he will see if he can dig up a copy of it

Financial donations above and beyond the normal dues were received from Neal Rohrke, Bill Johnston, and Don Dickey. Thanks very much, guys, it's *donations*, both of time and money that keep the Sky Knights a first rate club.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ELECTION: Vogel, Rich Kuenning, and Ray Kiser were elected to the

Executive Committee. Thank you guys. SPECIAL TOPIC OF DISCUSSION: Wilson Hardy asked if there was any interest in making a Sky Knight Directory with a picture of every member placed in the clubhouse to help us get to know one another. The membership seemed interested in having a directory. Wilson asked for volunteers with Digital Cameras to form a committee to look into accomplishing this task. Ron Vogel, Curley Roy, Bernie Smith, and Tom Wild volunteered to chair the committee. This will also aid us in determining if we have non-members flying at our field. Check the roster and check the pictures in the clubhouse. There must be a current AMA card and a current LSK card on the frequency pin for anyone to be flying including any visitors from other clubs from other cities.

Will It fly? Aircraft design contest

Rules:

Aircraft must be airworthy and *succe-ssfully* test flown before date of contest per AMA safety code general rule #1.

Aircraft should not be a stock – com-mercially available kit or A0.self designed or **radically** modified aircraft.

Categories:

Serious:

Design should display construction and or flight characteristics equal to or improved over current state of the art.

Tongue-in-Cheek:

Prop: Design should display only that it can **safely** fly. Use of non-standard construction techniques, configurations and materials encouraged.

Objectives:

Serious category: Promote design improvements in construction, use of materials and flight characteristics.

Tongue in cheek:

Provide a setting to express non-practical, eccentric designs, building materials or techniques. *The weirder the better...*

Awards:

This will be "for fun" event. Awards will be certificates of recognition of no monetary value. Award categories will be decided at the time of the contest. If you have any questions contact Tom Wild @ 489-7216
